The new Howard Lake Public Library is open! The new, net-zero library opened in its new location on August 12 at 817 8th Avenue. This monumental shift from its previous location at 617 6th Avenue was a true community effort. The Howard Lake-Waverly-Winsted football team, among many other volunteers, played a crucial role in the move. The planning and construction involved local interests as well as regional and statewide ones, including the City of Howard Lake, Great River Regional Library, the state of Minnesota, USDA Rural Development, and the Howard Lake Friends of the Library. This collaborative effort is a testament to the community's strength and unity.

Through efforts by library staff, library users will benefit from a refreshed collection of books and other materials. About 1,200 new books were sent to Howard Lake to be showcased on their new bookshelves.

Now, 25 years have passed. I am working, doing what I love to do with a supportive and loving family. I have passed on my love of books to my kids, who nowadays go on the Internet to find books instantaneously! Today is a time of instant gratification, and everything is just one click away. I cannot explain to them the excitement and anticipation of looking for a book you have been waiting to read and going and finding it at the local library. For me, libraries are still like old trusted friends. Patient and kind, always there when you need them, non-judgmental, everything you want in a good friend.



I am honored to have served on the board of my public library for the past seven years. I have a voice to speak up for my friend, the library, and ask not only for financial support but I am also able to share my opinion on a number of issues and help make it a welcoming place for all members of my community.
